## Course Descriptions

## Orchestra

Grade: 9,10,11,12
Prerequisites:
Admission by audition only
Minimum one year experience on an orchestral instrument

- Offered Zero Period
- Meets Fine Arts graduation requirements

Orchestra explores the intermediate level of orchestral literature through rehearsals and performances in concerts and festivals. In addition to rehearsals \& performances, the class also includes outside work including research papers and concert/listening reports. The Orchestra performs two evening concerts each year as well as at Graduation in June. Attendance at all three performances is mandatory. The Orchestra may also attend one festival competition each year for which there may be an additional fee.

## Advanced Orchestra

Grade: 10, 11, 12
Prerequisites:
Annual Audition
Previous participation Orchestra
Strong Performance Ability

- Offered Zero Period
- Meets Fine Arts graduation requirement

See the course description for "Orchestra" for the instrument complement and required performances. This weighted-grade course is taught in combination with the regular Orchestra class. Students approved for enrollment in Advanced Orchestra will be expected to take on more advanced tasks, research, and leadership roles within the Orchestra group. Some may be required to perform solos at the concerts and/or be the section leader for their instrument. Please refer to the PVPUSD High School Course Handbook for a full description of this class.

## Some Notes about Zero Period:

Zero Period is every day, starting at 7:00 a.m. Ms. Parkinson is usually there about 10 minutes prior to the start of class to open the band room and instrument locker room. On late start days, zero period still runs 7:00 a.m. to 7:55 a.m. Ms. Parkinson will frequently elect to hold a sectional on these days, when only instruments of a certain type are required to attend. She will let the students know which late-start days they must attend. Students should bring something to do for the 45 minutes between zero and 1st or 4th periods on those days. The library is usually open for students on campus during the faculty meetings.


## Jazz Band I

Grade: 9, 10, 11, 12
Prerequisite: Audition with instructor

- Offered $1^{\text {st }}$ Period
- Meets Fine Arts graduation requirements

Jazz Band I surveys the various styles of Jazz through rehearsals, performances and guided listening, and reviews the fundamentals and interpretations of jazz and jazz-rock music. Students rehearse and perform jazz of various styles (Blues, Afro-Cuban, bop, Swing, Fusion, etc.).

Jazz I performs in 2 concerts a year at PVHS and at several community events. For Instrumentation, see below.

## Jazz Band II

Grade: 10, 11, 12
Prerequisite: Audition with instructor

- Offered $4^{\text {th }}$ Period
- Meets Fine Arts graduation requirements

Jazz Band II is for the more advanced player, and includes surveys of the various styles of Jazz through rehearsals, performances and guided listening.

Jazz II Performs in 2 concerts a year at PVHS as well as at several community events.

Participation in all concerts is mandatory. For Instrumentation, see below.

Jazz I and II instrumentation is as follows for each class period:

## Concert Band/PE Band/Marching Band

Open to all Woodwind, Brass, \& Percussion players
Grade: 9,10,11,12
Prerequisite: Teacher approval required. Annual Audition is recommended

- Offered $2^{\text {nd }}$ Period
- Meets Fine Arts graduation requirements or PE requirements
The Band class at PVHS is run as the "Marching Band" through the football and holiday season, Pep band for the winter sports season, and Concert band in the last winter/spring seasons. It is taught as a year-long class with many required performances. Students will be issued music in June of the prior year to practice and learn on their own over summer.

Class starts in AUGUST with a required week-long "Band Camp" day camp at which students will learn the field show choreography for the coming football season. Camp is held the week prior to registration. The Marching Band portion of the course develops the musical and marching skills of students and prepares them for parades and field shows. Attendance at band camp and all home football games is required. Performing in the PV Holiday Parade may also be required. Throughout January \& February, students will perform at the home Varsity basketball games. During this period they will also be working on concert material culminating in a year-end concert in May. Other community functions and/or festival competitions may be added.

Students wishing to earn Fine Arts credit should enroll in "Concert Band". Those wishing to earn PE credit should enroll in "PE Band"

There is a fee for band camp to cover the cost of the instructors and supplies. If this poses a financial hardship for your family, please contact Ms. Parkinson.

## Concert Attire:

## Drumline

Grade: 9,10,11,12
Prerequisite: Teacher Approval

- Offered $2^{\text {nd }}$ Period in combination with Band
- Meets Fine Arts or PE credit graduation requirements

Drumline is an ensemble offering percussionists an opportunity to hone their skills, perform and represent PVHS in competitions. Those interested in Drumline should enroll in Concert Band or PE Band. With teacher approval, woodwind and brass players may also participate in Drumline. Auditions may be instituted if interest exceeds the number of available instruments.

Participation in Drumline will require weekend and after-school rehearsals and performances in addition to in-class instruction. Competitions are held on weekends, and attendance is mandatory, and will be included in the grading scale for those students.

There may be a membership fee to cover the costs of the Drumline production and instrument transportation. Student will wear schoolissued band uniforms, and are required to purchase band shoes and gloves. Fundraisers may help defray some of these costs. Parents will be asked to help carpool students to the competitions.

Drumline students participate in all Marching band, Pep band and Concert Band activities, as well as at five Drumline competitions in the LA/OC area. Drumline may also perform at one or two local community functions.

## Color Guard

New this year, Color Guard is open to all students. Students should enroll in PE Band, but need not play a musical instrument to participate in this group. Students will learn the fundamentals of field show performing in combination with the Marching band, using dance moves and colorful flags to add visual interest. Rifles and saber work may be added as the group progresses. Prior dance experience is helpful, but not required. Color Guard will perform with the Marching band at the football games and is expected to attend Band Camp in August. More information will follow as this group expands enrollment.

## Music Appreciation

Grades 9-12
Prerequisites: None
Music Appreciation provides the student with an overview of the development of Western Music from the Greeks to the modern era. We explore beginning theory concepts, musical forms, styles, instrument types and genres. No previous musical experience is required. Fourth quarter we will trace the development of two modern genres: Jazz and "Rock." The class includes extensive aural listening examples, visual viewing examples, guest performances and hands on experimentation. In short, it is fun!

## Music Theory AP

Grade: 10, 11, 12
Recommendation: if possible, take Music Appreciation before Music Theory.

- Offered $5^{\text {th }}$ Period
- Meets Fine Arts graduation requirements

Music theory is the study of methods for analyzing, classifying, and composing music, and the elements of music. Music theory generally attempts to reduce the practice of composing and playing into rules and ideas. It includes the study of the theoretical elements of music including pitch, rhythm, melody, harmony, and notation. This course is geared towards the classical theory and aural skills which students will need to pass the College Board AP exam given each May. Although it is not a performance class, students are required to sing.

## Chamber Chorale

Grades 9-12
Prerequisites: None

- Meets Fine Arts graduation requirements


This choir is the main choir at PVHS in which all interested singers should enroll. This choir performs beginning to intermediate A Cappella choral music in two concert seasons. The repertoire spans from the late Renaissance through the $20^{\text {th }}$ century. Attention is paid to vocal development, tone, blend, ear training and rudimentary theory. Solo opportunities exist. There are two mandatory concerts (Winter \& Spring) and additional concerts are scheduled at school, district and community request. There are two mandatory recording sessions (Winter \& Spring). Choral part sectionals are added as required. In performance this ensemble is listed as the A Cappella Choir. The PVHS A Cappella Choir is noted for its beautiful tone and excellent intonation.

## Chamber Choir

Grades 9-12
Prerequisites: Concurrent membership in the Chamber Chorale

- Meets Fine Arts graduation requirements

This choir is the select mixed voice choir at PVHS. The membership is drawn from the Chorale (A Cappella Choir). All interested singers should enroll. The Conductor will determine final enrollment. This choir performs intermediate to advanced A Cappella choral music in two concert seasons. The repertoire spans from the Renaissance to the $20^{\text {th }}$ Century. Attention is paid to vocal development, ear training, blend, tone and theory. Solo opportunities exist. There are two mandatory concerts (Winter \& Spring) and additional concerts are scheduled at school, district and community request. There are two mandatory recording sessions (Winter \& Spring). Choral part sectionals are added as required. In performance this ensemble is listed as the Madrigal Singers.

## Men's Choir

Grades 9-12
Prerequisites: Concurrent membership in the Chamber Chorale - Meets Fine Arts graduation requirements This choir is the male voice choir at PVHS. The membership is drawn from the Chorale (A Cappella Choir). All interested singers should enroll. This choir performs A Cappella choral music in two concert seasons. Attention is paid to vocal development, ear training, blend, tone and theory. Solo opportunities exist. There are two mandatory concerts (Winter \& Spring) and additional concerts are scheduled at school, district and community request. There are two mandatory recording sessions (Winter \& Spring). Choral part sectionals are added as required. The repertoire covers the traditional male collegiate genre: Glees, Chantey's, Motets, Spirituals , Folk Songs, Love Songs, Fight Songs.

## Women's Choir

Grades 9-12
Prerequisites: Concurrent membership in the Chamber Chorale - Meets Fine Arts graduation requirements This choir is the female voice choir at PVHS. The membership is drawn from the Chorale (A Cappella Choir). All interested singers should enroll. This choir performs A Cappella choral music in two concert seasons. Attention is paid to vocal development, ear training, blend, tone and theory. Solo opportunities exist. There are two mandatory concerts (Winter \& Spring) and additional concerts are scheduled at school, district and community request. There are two mandatory recording sessions (Winter \& Spring). Choral part sectionals are added as required. The repertoire covers the traditional women's collegiate genre: Motets, Spirituals, Folk Songs, Love Songs, Madrigals, and Whimsical Songs. We hope to add this choir in 2009.

## Guitar

Grades 9-12
Prerequisites: None
Open to all students with interest in playing or learning to play the guitar. The class is open to acoustic and electric musicians. The purpose of this course is to improve or generate guitar-playing proficiency. While the development of the guitar as a concert and stage instrument will be
covered, this is primarily a playing course. Students will be encouraged to form duets, combos, bands etc. and hold performances. Local guitar clinicians will be invited to instruct students. Students are expected to enroll with a wide range of experience and talents. Improvement is the goal. This course debuts 2009.

## Voice

Grades 9-12
Prerequisites: None
This course is designed as a beginning group vocal class. Students of all experience levels are invited to enroll. All aspects of voice will be addressed. Students will be expected to learn two pieces per semester for performance in PVHS voice recitals. Enrollment is limited so that the instructor can provide as much individual instruction as possible. Preference will be given to students concurrently enrolled in a music class at PVHS. We hope to add this course in 2009.

## Audition \& Music Group Recommendations

The PVHS music department strongly urges ALL music students to join choir. Students who sing play better with a nicer phrase and superior intonation. Singing improves the ear and sight-reading ability. Further, in college, music majors are required to sing and pass sight-singing courses.

Thus, we strongly urge students to develop these essential skills in the PVHS Choir! If you sing or want to sing you should enroll in choir. If voice is your instrument there is no required audition piece.

If you play Violin, Viola, Cello, or Harp:
Audition for Orchestra or Advanced Orchestra
If you play String Bass:
Audition for Orchestra, Adv. Orchestra, Jazz I or Jazz II.
If you play Bassoon, Clarinet, Bass Clarinet, Flute, Piccolo, or Oboe:
Audition for Orchestra, Adv. Orchestra or Band.
If you play a Brass instrument of any kind
Audition for any music group.
If you play Piano
Audition for any music group If you play Saxophone (any type)

Audition for Band, Jazz I, or Jazz II If you play Electric Guitar or Electric Bass Guitar

Audition for Jazz I or Jazz II only.

Please note; all the music groups have required performances outside the normal school day. Participation in these concerts and competitions is mandatory, and counts heavily towards the student's semester grades. Students also enrolling in school athletics, drama, or other school classes also requiring non-school-hour practices, shows, games, and competitions will need to compare schedules carefully and enroll only in those that do not have conflicts with other classes.
